Board Matters

The August 2024 Board Meeting was held on August 15 at 7:00 p.m. in the BRUU Conference Room and is available on Zoom, except for a Closed Executive Session.

At this meeting, the Board approved the Consent Agenda including reports from the President, Vice President, Program Council, Membership and Staff (via Staff Coordinator). Attachments to support agenda items were: Finance Committee Charter, Sexton Offer Letter, and Memorandum of Understanding draft for ACTS.

The general meeting held discussion on these agenda items:

- Vacancies and Assignments: The Board approved Allen Curlee's assignment to serve as liaison to the Endowment Committee; DRE Kristin Worthington has agreed to be the lead on this year's fire drills in coordination with Mike Freeland; The Board suggested that our new Sexton be asked to consider working with current volunteers on the Safety Camera and Internet Cabling project proposed last year but delayed due to leadership bandwidth limitations; and Michelle Fegeas-Foster will work with Angie to update the general and board Perpetual Calendars.
- Town Hall follow up: The Board agrees on priorities set by the Retreat in July and discussed challenges to adequately survey the congregation. Vice President Annaliess Trommatter will serve as lead on this project, exploring various ways to engage the congregation in providing input for BRUU's next steps, including the possibility of a future Ministerial Search, with the goal of reporting her progress to the Board by the next board meeting.
- **Finance:** Committee Chair Dave Hamilton reviewed BRUU's budget process and received Board approval of the updated Finance Committee Charter; and board member Allan Curlee will take on the task of finding a new CPA and reporting back to Terrie and David Hamilton, with whom the CPA will be connected for a meeting to gain access to our financial records; and Finance Committee has agreed that a Contracts Team is needed to research comparative

rental fees for space use of our Fellowship Hall, Flamingo Lounge, etc. and then make a recommendation to the Board for an increase for these spaces.

- Pantry and USDA/TEPAC Requirements: New member Len Clark has
 worked with Laura Crowne and has agreed to serve as USDA Administrator
 (replacing Terrie McClure) with assistance from Ed Stewart who serves as Data
 Entry volunteer so that all USDA requirements on data management and food
 storage are met; and
- Review and Revisions of Board Roles and Responsibilities: Each member is reminded to revise their Board job description (with a suggestion to fit it on one page). The Vice President has sent the revised draft to the President. Angie will write a Youth Representative position (job) description and discuss it with Sashka.

New Business: The Board accepts David's recommendation that we agree to provide feedback on the use of the UUA Virtual Hymnal; Terrie will be POC to review the updated UUA Retirement Plan 2025 Restatement with personnel and report back to the Board before the next meeting; and the Board questions a hardship element in the proposed Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) for a BRUU partnership with ACTS regarding our Community Assistance Funds. Issues will be addressed by Angie once she is updated by Michelle Fegeas-Foster who will check with Mt Olive Baptist on how they manage their hardship fund.

Executive Session: Exit Interview feedback and Healing Session. No votes made.


CUUPS (Covenant of Unitarian Universalist Pagans) at the Crossroads



Second Sunday Hike—September 8th






